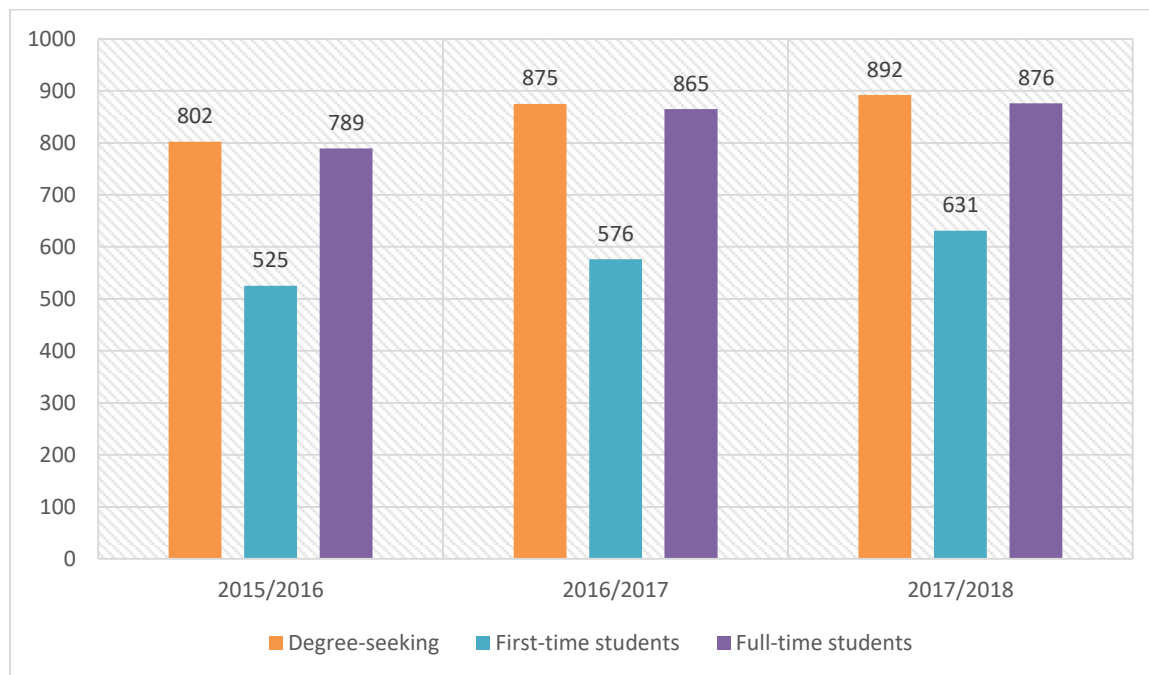

3.10. The graduates of the four-year programs may be divided into the following five groups:

- graduates who were accepted for to the residency in the U.S.A. or Canada
- graduates who have remained in Europe for the duration of their residency - primarily Great Britain, Ireland, Germany, Sweden, Norway, and Malta
- graduates who have remained for their residency in Poland, mostly those fluent in the Polish language
- graduates continuing their Ph.D. studies in Poland
- graduates on a one-year leave of absence
